How to Convert Email to Text Message

- 1. Ask the text message recipient for the recipient's cell phone number and wireless service provider.
- 2. Identify the email domain for the recipient's cell phone number. The most popular wireless providers and their email domains are Verizon (vtext.com), AT&T (txt.att.com), SprintPCS (messaging.sprintpcs.com), T-Mobile (tmomail.com), Boost (myboostmobile.com), Virgin Mobile (@mobl.com), SprintNextel (messaging.nextel.com) and Straight Talk (vtext.com).
- 3. Open your local or web-based email application.
- 4. Open a blank email document to compose a new email message, or open an existing email you wish to convert to a text message.
- 5. In the email message "To:" field enter the recipient's 10-digit phone number (including area code) without spaces. Type the @ symbol followed by the wireless provider's email domain (e.g. number@vtext.com).
- 6. Compose the email message, or add comments as needed to an existing email message.
- 7. Send the email message. The email message will be sent to the recipient's cell phone as a text message.
